## **Chapter 1. Quick Start**

#### **Install TouchRight Utilities**

There are various ways to obtain IMG software, including (but not limited to):

- Web based / Internet download from IMG's web site (http://www.imgpresents.com/demo.htm)
- Shipped CD / DVD physical media IMG Product Disc
- · Download ISO image file and burn IMG Product Disc CD / DVD
- USB Flash Drive (pre-installed or installed from USB media web download)
- Single file install (from local network / internet / other media)
- · IMG on-line account

**Note:** IMG Software is built by product and major version with minor releases. There is only 1 unique build, but can be packaged / delivered / obtained in various ways. When unlicensed, the software acts as a demonstration / evaluation copy, and operation will be limited in length or run-time or capabilities. Once licensed (typically via License Key and Serial Number, or OEM / Company-wide / Enterprise licensing), the software will operate with no limitations.

**Recommendation:** The quickest and easiest method for obtaining IMG software is to download the current version from IMG's web site (http://www.imgpresents.com/demo.htm). Download, then run the file to install. Test, review, play with, and verify the software meets your needs and requirements. When ready to purchase, go to the IMG License Manager, and click on the "Purchase License Now" button. If working on a machine without internet access, use the Standard or MSI single file download, or use a Product Disc option. Separately, purchase the license for the product directly on the website - once you have your License Key and Serial Number, you can install and license the software.

The following outlines a standard retail Product Disc based install. For other options, refer to notes and details available at the source. In general, the approach is to install the software, then license the software. The Product Disc Installation Assistant provides an easy way to accomplish these two tasks.

- In Windows, insert the CD or DVD the AutoRun feature will load the Installation Assistant you
  may Install a licensed product, Install other product demos, or view Release Information. If you have
  a Certificate of Authenticity, enter your License Key, Serial Number, and Name to Install and
  automatically License.
- If AutoRun is not enabled:
- In Windows, Click on the Start Button
- · Select Run
- Select D:SETUP, or type D:SETUP (or E:SETUP if CD/DVD drive E:, etc.)
- Press (ENTER) or click on OK

- In Windows Vista, you may not have the Run Option select Computer, your CD/DVD drive, and open Setup
- Answer the questions and follow the instructions on your screen

**Note:** You may also Un-Install TouchRight Utilities by running SETUP.EXE After TouchRight Utilities has been properly installed. (TouchRight Utilities Setup will ask you if you wish to Un-Install.) This has been provided as a convenience to the user. It is recommended that you use the Control Panel | Add/Remove Programs Icon to remove TouchRight Utilities.

#### Start TouchRight Utilities

Click on the Start Button, and open the Start Menu.

Select (All) Programs, then Select TouchRight Utilities. TouchRight Utilities menu will have selections corresponding to the icons in the group. Select TouchRight Utilities to begin operation.

TouchRight Utilities will automatically run after install. You may click on the small icon in the tray (near the clock) for TouchRight Utilities menu. Refer to the on-line help, and the User's guide for features and capabilities of TouchRight Utilities.

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## **Using this Guide**

This guide is a comprehensive collection of details, notes, and information about TouchRight Utilities. Portions are incorporated within the product itself, and it is also available in various forms (e.g. printed, on-line, PDF, etc.).

#### **Important User Information**

This guide is for users who are familiar with Windows, its basic concepts, and how to operate within Windows. If you are not, the information you may need to fully utilize TouchRight Utilities and this guide may be limited. You may wish to review Windows help, tutorials, and other available information on using and operating Windows before continuing using this guide.



## What is TouchRight Utilities?

If you are using touch screen there is no easy way to right click. TouchRight Utilities provides easy interface for performing right clicking. To Toggle from a Left-Click to the Right-Click or back again, simply touch TouchRight Utilities window (above the Menu Button). The current state of your touch will be indicated by LEFT or RIGHT. Anytime you wish to change the type of Click, simply touch the TouchRight Utilities window. Refer to your touchscreen information for more details on using your touchscreen.



## Why do I need TouchRight Utilities?

TouchRight Utilities were created to allow a quick and easy way to perform a right-click (context menu / Properties) action via an easy to use and understand interface. When originally created, it was not common for Touchscreen and Pen drivers to provide an easy way to access the right-click. Now that most drivers do provide a mechanism to perform a right-click, customers still find the simple interface, added tools, utilities, and options built into TouchRight Utilities valuable. TouchRight Utilities provides versatility and features not found in generic right-click functions provided by the Touchscreen or Pen driver.

### **Features**

- · Easy to use and understand approach to access Right-Click functionality from a single click interface
- Single-Right click feature monitors action and reverts immediately back to a left click after a right-click event, or operate in fixed mode until user toggles action
- · Pre-defined positions, along with complete size and position flexibility
- · Window and system interface options for ease of use / access

- · Hide until Taskbar active easy way to hide, but still quickly access functions
- · Operator only option
- Windows System functions shutdown, log off, restart
- · Flexible options to handle configuration and configuration menu

**Note:** You may also Un-Install TouchRight Utilities by running SETUP.EXE After TouchRight Utilities has been properly installed. (TouchRight Utilities Setup will ask you if you wish to Un-Install.) This has been provided as a convenience to the user. It is recommended that you use the Control Panel | Add/Remove Programs Icon to remove TouchRight Utilities.

## **Starting TouchRight Utilities**

Click on the Start Button, and open the Start Menu. Select (All) Programs, then Select TouchRight Utilities. TouchRight Utilities menu will have selections corresponding to the icons in the group. Select TouchRight Utilities to begin operation.

The following icons will also be available in TouchRight Utilities group:

TouchRight Utilities - runs TouchRight Utilities

TouchRight Utilities Help - opens TouchRight Utilities Help (opens this document)

**Licensing Information** - Displays current license status of TouchRight Utilities, allows instant licensing Refer to TouchRight Utilities Operation Notes for a quick overview of TouchRight Utilities.

## **Licensing Information**

TouchRight Utilities uses the IMG License Manager to manage the licensed use of this product. If unlicensed, the product will run as demo (i.e. a demonstration version). In the demo (unlicensed) mode, TouchRight Utilities will run for about an hour, and then exit, displaying the license manager (announcing that it is unlicensed). You may restart TouchRight Utilities up to 100 times (the demonstration period limit). After the demonstration period is over, TouchRight Utilities will not operate unless it is licensed. For extended evaluation and testing purposes, please contact IMG Customer Service for an evaluation license. Once licensed, the operation will not be limited in any way.


The most common methods of licensing are electronic (web/e-mail based) and by certificate (Certificate of Authenticity). In both cases, there will be a registered serial number, and a license key made available once a license has been purchased - these need to be entered into the IMG License Manager to activate a valid license. For further details, refer to the IMG License Manager. There is also USB storage device licensing, so TouchRight Utilities can be run from the USB device, simply by inserting the licensed device into any system.

**Note:** There are numerous license schemes (including OEM, site, & enterprise licenses) available to meet the needs of all our customers. If you have any licensing questions, please contact Innovation Management Group, Inc. directly.

## **License Manager**

In order to License TouchRight Utilities, the correct License Key and Serial Number must be entered into the IMG License Manager, along with some text for the Customer (and optional Company) text areas. The License Key and Serial Number can be found on the Certificate of Authenticity, or in the Software Unlock Codes e-mail.

#### **TouchRight Utilities License Manager - Authentication**



The License Key and Serial No. entries are a matched pair, and will work together to unlock the software. The Customer entry is required (i.e. some text must be entered in the Customer text area), but is not part of the license unlock process. The Company text area is optional, and will be shown as the Source when the product is licensed.

To quickly and easily license the software (on a system that has internet access), simply click on the "Purchase License Now" button. Once connected to IMG's website, you will be asked to enter billing information and payment information. Once paid, your order will be processed, and you will receive a confirmation e-mail and a separate e-mail with license information. Once the order is fully processed, you can then click the "Retrieve Purchased License" button to automatically license your system.

**System ID Note:** The System ID is used to accurately match the Product and Version you wish to license with the License Information provided. If the system you wish to License does not have Internet Access, you can use the Copy System ID to Clipboard to accurately copy the System ID to the clipboard (which can be saved in a text file or other document and moved to a system that does have Internet Access).

Note: The "Retrieve Purchased License" uses a unique identifier to automatically license your


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**Important Note:** Be sure to save and/or print your Order Confirmation number (with Order E-mail), along with your License Key and Serial Number in case you need to re-license the software in the future (Operating System Re-install, hard disk reformat, new system, etc.)

**Certificate of Authenticity Note:** For Electronic Licenses, and Certificate of Authenticity can be retrieved on IMG's website: https://www.imgpresents.com/orders/account/licmanager.htm. This requires a valid License Key and Serial Number. Once entered, you may view a PDF of the Certificate, or download the Certificate of Authenticity PDF file (for printing or saving).

### **TouchRight Utilities License Manager - Additional License**

#### **Options**



The Additional License Options section has tools and options to Enter or Paste Evaluation or Other License Information; Request and Retrieve Evaluation Licenses; Support Options to View and Delete (Reset) the License file; and a mechanism to retrieve a Purchased License by entering the Order Confirmation Number and the Order E-mail address.

Often, interested parties want to review or test the software without the demonstration license limitations, and to accommodate this, IMG makes available Evaluation Licenses. These Evaluation Licenses are fully functional licenses, but with a date limit (when the evaluation date has passed, the software will return back to the Unlicensed, Demonstration mode).

Evaluation Licenses may be requested at the Product Download pages on the website, or by using the Request / Retrieve Evaluation License button here. Note that all Evaluation License requests are reviewed, and Evaluation Licenses must be created by IMG personnel (generation is not automated).

An Evaluation License sent via e-mail contains a block of text that has the license details for the License Manager. When sent via e-mail, the text can be copied and subsequently pasted into the text area here (Paste Text from Clipboard), then saved to enable (set) the License Information (Save License Info).

Alternatively, if an Evaluation License is Requested, then after processing, it may be automatically Retrieved directly by clicking the Request / Retrieve Evaluation License button. Please refer to any additional information provided by the messages shown when using this approach.

The View Current License File (LICENSE.LIC) button will load the file LICENSE.LIC from the installation folder. This file contains the actual license information for the product, or the license information used to validate a License Key and Serial Number.

**Note:** Because an Evaluation License uses this same file, the Delete (Reset) option should be used if Licensing the product after using an Evaluation License.


The Delete (Reset) License File (LICENSE.LIC) will remove the existing LICENSE.LIC, then copy the file LICENSE.ORG to LICENSE.LIC (both in the installation folder). The file LICENSE.ORG is the "as shipped" license file, and should be the License File when using a License Key and Serial Number to license the software.

**Note:** For License Purposes, using the Support Option to Delete (Reset) the License File is essentially the same as un-installing, then re-installing the software. Because this option is quicker and simpler, it is the preferred approach to resolve any license issues. Note that manually copying the file LICENSE.ORG to LICENSE.LIC (in the installation folder) performs the same operation as this option.

The License Retrieval Option will retrieve License Information from IMG's Website for electronically purchased licenses. The Order Confirmation Number and Order E-mail is required (which appear on the Order Confirmation page provided after successfully placing an on-line order, and are provided separately via an Order Confirmation E-mail).

**Note:** For Retrieved Licenses (via Retrieve Purchased License, and via the Retrieve License Support Option), License Key and Serial Number information is processed exactly as if this information was directly entered in the Authentication area. Therefore, all issues that may affect licensing also apply to these automated options (e.g. License File status, User permissions, etc.)

## **TouchRight Utilities License Manager - Licensed Display**



When properly Licensed, a screen similar to this will show the License Information for the product. The display of this indicates that the software is Licensed.

Note: Evaluation licenses also show this screen during the days that the Evaluation License is valid.


## **Chapter 3. TouchRight Utilities Operation**

## Toggle Left-Click / Right-Click


Toggle Left-Click / Right-Click



To Toggle from a Left-Click to the Right-Click or back again, simply touch TouchRight Utilities window (above the Menu Button). The current state of your touch will be indicated by LEFT or RIGHT. Anytime you wish to change the type of Click, simply touch the TouchRight Utilities window.




If you hide the Menu portion of the window, the entire area is used to Toggle from a Left-Click to a Right-Click. The display indicates what type of click you are currently using.



When you are in a Right-Click mode, the window display will change to indicate the type of click that is active.

## **Using TouchRight Utilities Menu**

Using the Menu



By clicking anywhere on the Menu Button (lower third of TouchRight Utilities window), you will open a Popup Menu that allows you to access various options within TouchRight Utilities.

If the Menu button is not visible (Clear Menu Until Resized option), you can resize the TouchRight Utilities window to refresh and show the Menu button. Optionally (if enabled), there will be a taskbar icon in the tray (near clock and other small icons) that can be used to access the Menu.



The Menu options are discussed in the following sections.

#### **Position Menu**



#### Position

Selecting Position opens another menu that lets you select one of 9 screen positions. They include the following:

- · Top-Left
- · Top-Center
- · Top-Right
- · Mid-Left
- Mid-Center
- · Mid-Right
- · Bottom-Left
- Bottom-Center
- · Bottom-Right
- Custom: Displays notes on custom sizing.


When one of the 9 fixed options is selected, the entire TouchRight Utilities window will be moved to the screen position indicated. You also have the option of using the sizing borders to change the size and/or position of TouchRight Utilities. You may click & drag the borders to position the TouchRight Utilities window anywhere on your screen at any size.

**Note:** To easily move the window position, you have the option of showing the Window Title bar (Show Window Title bar in Options Menu). Otherwise, you typically need to perform two sizing operations (click & drag) to position and size the window at any particular screen location.

## **Options Menu**



#### **Options**

Selecting Options opens another menu that lets you select one of 4 operation options. They include the following:

- · Always Topmost Window
- Single Right-Click Only
- · Show Taskbar Icon
- · Show Window Title bar

#### **Always Topmost Window**

This toggles whether TouchRight Utilities is always topmost (always visible above other windows) or not. A Check Mark in the menu indicates that the Topmost setting is active. For best results, it is recommended that the Topmost setting be On.

#### Single Right-Click Only

When toggled On (Check Mark in menu), only a single Right-Click is allowed (right button down, right button up) - after the right button up event, the TouchRight Utilities automatically switches back to the Left-Click. When Off, you must touch the TouchRight Utilities window to toggle back to the Left-Click. Most people prefer this setting to be active, but there may be situations where this automatic action is not desired.


#### **Show Taskbar Icon**

This toggles whether TouchRight Utilities displays a small icon in the System Tray (near clock and other small icons). This provides an alternate way to access the Menu, and can be useful when the Clear Menu option is selected.

#### **Show Window Title bar**

This toggles whether TouchRight Utilities displays a Window title bar (Caption bar). Having a title bar provides an easier way to drag the window during operation. If moving the TouchRight Utilities window during normal operation is not required or desired, often the title bar is not displayed.

## **Configure Default Opening Menu**



#### **Configure Default Opening**

Selecting Configure Default Opening displays another menu where you can determine the opening configuration (e.g. how TouchRight Utilities opens when started). There are 8 combinations, along with a Save Current Settings Option. Whenever a specific combination is selected, its configuration settings will be saved immediately. To test the configuration settings, use the Close without save option on the main menu.

- · Open with Menu button
- · Open with No Menu button
- · Open with Menu, Taskbar Icon
- · Open with No Menu, Taskbar Icon
- · Open with Menu, Title bar
- Open with No Menu, Title bar
- · Open with Menu, Taskbar Icon, Title bar
- Open with No Menu, Taskbar Icon, Title bar
- · Save Current Settings

#### Open with Menu button

This option does not include the Window Title bar, or the taskbar icon, and will display the window with sizing borders, and the menu button.

#### Open with No Menu button

This option does not include the Window Title bar, or the taskbar icon, and will display the window with sizing borders only, no menu button.

#### Open with Menu, Taskbar Icon

This option will show the Taskbar Icon, but does not include the Window Title bar, and will display the window with sizing borders only, and the menu button.

Taskbar Icon: Yes

#### Open with No Menu, Taskbar Icon

This option will show the Taskbar Icon, but does not include the Window Title bar, and will display the window with sizing borders only, and no menu button.

• Window Title bar: No

· Taskbar Icon: Yes

#### Open with Menu, Title bar

This option includes the Window Title bar with sizing borders, and the menu button, but no Taskbar Icon.

· Window Title bar: Yes

· Taskbar Icon: No

#### Open with No Menu, Title bar

This option includes the Window Title bar with sizing borders, but no menu button and no Taskbar Icon.

· Taskbar Icon: No

#### Open with Menu, Taskbar Icon, Title bar

This option includes the Window Title bar with sizing borders and the Taskbar Icon, along with the menu button.

## **Hide until Taskbar Active**

#### **Hide until Taskbar Active**

When selected, the TouchRight Utilities window hides until the Windows Taskbar becomes active. This is a mode to recover screen real-estate, but have the TouchRight Utilities window immediately available when required. When hidden, simply touch a clear area of the Taskbar (i.e. next to an task button (icon button)).

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** If you select this option, and you still see the TouchRight Utilities window or you see it flash, then the Taskbar is currently the active window - open another application window, or click on the desktop before selecting this menu option again.

**Note:** On some versions of Windows, the Start Menu may also activate the taskbar, causing the TouchRight Utilities window to be shown.

**Note:** If you have the Taskbar Icon configured, you can also make the TouchRight Utilities window visible by de-selecting the Hide until Taskbar Active option.

## Clear Menu until Resized


#### **Clear Menu until Resized**

When selected, this options temporarily clears the menu button, so the entire window will toggle the left/right action. When the sizing borders are selected, and the window is resized (however slightly), the Menu button will be shown again.

**Note:** If you have the Taskbar Icon configured, you can access the menu directly from the small icon. Also, you can make the menu button visible again by de-selecting the Clear Menu until Resized option.

### Windows Menu

This selection opens a menu with the following selections:

#### **Shutdown Windows**

This initiates the Shutdown sequence for Windows.

#### **Exit Windows (Logoff)**


Ends the current Windows session.

#### **Reboot System**

This resets the entire system (Warm Start).

**Note:** This menu can be disabled by setting Operator=1 in the TRT.INI file. See the TRT.INI file in the installation directory for more details.

## Help Menu



#### **About**

Displays current version, copyright, and basic information about the TouchRight Utilities.

#### Help

Opens this Help file.

#### Check for Updates...

Opens the IMG Download Manager that can be used to check for product updates and options.

## **Close without Save**

#### **Close without Save**

This will Close and Exit TouchRight Utilities without performing any additional action, and the current position, size, and current settings will not be saved.

## **Close & Save Settings**

**Close & Save Settings** 

This will Close and Exit TouchRight Utilities, and the current settings will be saved. The window position, and any features or options enabled will be used when TouchRight Utilities is opened the next time.

#### **Advanced User Notes & Information**

## TouchRight Utilities Initialization File Documentation (TRT.INI)

Listed below are settings and information for specific applications that require special actions by TouchRight Utilities, along with the Configuration settings for TouchRight Utilities.

All Settings are the default Settings of TouchRight Utilities.

#### Registry vs. INI

The default approach is to use the settings in the registry for the current user, i.e. the key [HKEY\_CURRENT\_USER\Software\Innovation Management Group\TouchRight Utilities\Settings]. These same settings names are in the TRT.INI file in the [Settings] section. There are also comments and notes in the TRT.INI located in the Installation folder. Note that if the registry entries are not present, the TRT.INI is read, and these settings are the default settings for the current user (assuming that DoNotUseRegistry=0 in the TRT.INI) - the Registry settings for the current user will be used from then on. Registry settings for the current user (or any other user) are NOT removed when TouchRight Utilities is un-installed.

#### DoNotUseRegistry=0

If DoNotUseRegistry=0, then the registry is used for the current user. The INI file is only used for initial settings for a user with no current settings.

If DoNotUseRegistry=1, then the INI file is used (and user must have read/write access to the INI file to access and update the settings in the INI file). This setting is typically used when running from a removable drive, such as a USB drive.

#### Topmost=1

Window is Always on Top if TopMost=1. The TouchRight Utilities window is a normal sizable popup window if TopMost=0. This is the setting for the Always Topmost Window in the Options Menu.

#### SingleClick=1

This setting sets system hook to monitor for right-click up event. If SingleClick=1, then the right-click up event triggers TouchRight Utilities to automatically return to left-click. If SingleClick=0, then user must manually click on TouchRight Utilities window to return to the left-click mode of operation. This is the setting for the Single Right-Click Only in the Options Menu.

#### OpenPositionX=0

#### OpenPositionY=0

OpenPositionX and OpenPositionY indicate where on screen TouchRight window should Open - X & Y indicate Top Left Corner. Default is center of screen. 0 indicates use default. Therefore, window cannot open at position 0,0 - use -1,-1 or 1,1

#### OpenWidth=0

#### OpenHeight=0

OpenWidth and OpenHeight indicate size of window. Default window is about 100 x 100. 0 indicates use default. Do not use values below 20.

#### Operator=0

This is an INI setting only (not accessible via the product / user interface - Also, it is not present in the Registry unless manually created). The Operator setting affects the menu available to the user. If Operator=0, then the full menu is available, and all options, including restarting windows, etc. are included. If Operator=1, then no menu is available to the user. This setting is for controlled situations where the user is considered an operator, not an administrator.

#### ShowTitleBar=0

The ShowTitleBar will change the window style when creating the window. If ShowTitleBar=1, then the window style will be created with a titlebar and close button. If ShowTitleBar=0, then the window will be a sizeable popup window with no title bar or other window decorations. This is the setting for the Show Window Title bar in the Options Menu.

#### ShowTaskbarIcon=0

If this setting is included, it will establish the default setting for the visibility of the taskbar icon in the tray (next to clock). If ShowTaskbarIcon=0, there will be no icon shown. If ShowTaskbarIcon=1, the icon will be shown in the tray, and the menu will be accessible from this icon. This is the setting for the Show Taskbar Icon in the Options Menu.

#### HideUntilTaskbar=0

If this setting is included, it will establish the default setting for the visibility of the window. If HideUntilTaskbar=0, operation will be normal. If HideUntilTaskbar=1, the TouchRight Utilities window will be hidden until the Taskbar obtains the input focus (i.e. it is clicked). This is the setting for the Hide until Taskbar Active.

#### HideMenuUntilResized=0

If this setting is included, it will establish the default setting for the visibility of the menu indicator in the TouchRight Utilities window. If HideMenuUntilResized=0, the menu will be visible, and a click in the bottom third will open the menu. If HideMenuUntilResized=1, the menu will not be shown, and the full

window will handle the left/right toggle, until the TouchRight Utilities window is resized. This is the setting for the Clear Menu until Resized.

## **Application Notes**

#### **Topmost Windows**

Topmost windows will always be above all other windows. The window manager sorts multiple topmost windows based on the order of when the topmost window attribute setting was set. If there are multiple topmost windows in the system, the window manager needs some way to order these windows (there can be only one topmost window in the list, and if there are multiple windows with the topmost attribute, some sort of ordering is required). When multiple windows are topmost, it is possible TouchRight Utilities will not be visible. One option is to clear the Always Topmost setting, then reset it. If you are in control of the application that is topmost, you have the option of using the SetWindowPos API call to control the order of the topmost windows. You may run TouchRight Utilities after all other applications and topmost windows have been created and shown, to ensure it is the last window set with the topmost window attribute.

**Note:** Applications and other programs may also force the topmost setting for their windows - TouchRight Utilities only sets this attribute when its window is created, so if TouchRight Utilities is NOT the topmost window, then it is likely other windows have this attribute, or are forcing this attribute, causing the TouchRight Utilities window to be lower in the Z order for topmost windows. If additional assistance regarding this topic is required for your particular application, please contact IMG customer service.

#### **Device Compatibility**

Over the years the product has been available, every once in a while, a question about an otherwise unheard of touchscreen device will be raised. From what we can gather, there are some low volume touchscreen interfaces that do not use the standard pointing device interface via a Windows compatible driver. In these cases, the approach used in TouchRight Utilities does not appear to affect the Left/Right toggle. Specifically, TouchRight Utilities will work fine with a physical mouse connected to the system, but the touchscreen itself is not affected by the TouchRight Utilities. So any device that does not use a driver, and perhaps uses higher-level functions (APIs such as SendInput, mouse\_event, etc.) to create the mouse click events will effectively bypass the swapped mouse buttons to generate Left/Right events. This is why IMG always recommends interested parties download and test with any IMG software to ensure that the results are satisfactory, especially if non-standard hardware is being used.

**Note:** In some cases, other IMG software may be useful in providing a complete system. For example, using the Shift-F10 keystroke combo will open Context/Property menus, and can be accessed via the IMG My-T-Soft family of on-screen keyboards. Also tools such as SmartClick may provide other functionality necessary when working with devices that don't truly replace the mouse / pointing device interface.
